# **School Photos**

We are delighted to announce the return of school photos in collaboration with our Parents Association. On Friday, October 6th, we have arranged for professional photography services to be provided by Michael and his team from County Photos.

Here's a brief overview of what Michael will be offering:

1. **Family Photos:** Each family unit in the school will have the opportunity to have their photograph taken.

2. <u>Individual and Sibling Photos</u>: Junior Infants and 6th class pupils will be photographed individually and with their siblings. Pupils from Senior Infants to 5th Class will have the option to be photographed with their siblings or on their own if they do not have a sibling in the school.

3. <u>Multiple Poses:</u> You will have the choice of two poses for each family unit at no additional cost. You can select from image 1, image 2, or even a combination of both.

4. <u>Class Group Photos:</u> A class group photo will be taken for each classroom group.

# Email Communication & Whatsapp

We appreciate the value of class whatsapp groups and welcome these. We remind all participants to model the behaviour that we expect of our children when we are online and engaging in conversation related to our school.

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## Uniform

A reminder that the following is our **<u>accepted school uniform</u>**:

ALL PUPILS: White polo shirt, blue jumper with Dominican crest & black/navy shoes.

**GIRLS**: Pinafore/skirt in bedfordshire tartan, black/navy/white tights, black/navy/white socks or grey trousers.

**BOYS:** Grey trousers.

**Optional**:

BOYS & GIRLS: may wear knee-length navy shorts in very hot weather

The P.E. uniform consists of: Plain navy tracksuit, runners with grips, white polo shirt

Not Permitted:

- **Earrings:** Only stud earrings are allowed; other types of earrings (e.g., hoops, dangly earrings etc) are not permitted.
- **Jewellery:** Any jewellery that could be deemed to harm the wearer or others, including sharp items, is not allowed.
- Nail Varnish: Nail varnish or false nails are not permitted.
- *Makeup*: Students are not allowed to wear makeup during school hours.
- **Footwear:** Runners that are not deemed to be correct sports runners for uniform days are not allowed. Runners should not be worn with formal uniform attire either.
- **Shorts:** Black cycling or lycra-style shorts are not part of the school uniform and should not be worn during school hours.
- *Hairstyle:* Dyed, bleached, or distracting coloured hairstyles are not permitted. Hairstyles should be of a neat and natural appearance.

Any breach / non compliance with our school uniform will be dealt with in accordance with our **<u>Code of Behaviour.</u>** 

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## Attendance

Our school is **<u>duty bound</u>** to report all absences to the Education Welfare Officer. We would like to remind all parents/guardians to please ensure that you <u>**record the reason**</u> for your child's absence via the <u>**Aladdin App**</u>.

Last year saw a 2.8% year-on-year improvement in attendance. However, we acknowledge that there is still a significant amount of work to be done to close the gap to the attendance figures we achieved in pre covid times.

Our mission this year is clear: we are determined to not only bridge the gap but to do our very best to surpass the attendance numbers witnessed pre covid. Achieving this goal will not only reflect the commitment of our pupils but also the collective team effort of our entire school community.

In the coming weeks, we will be sharing our attendance figures for September and comparing them to previous years. It is hugely important to emphasise that, under no circumstances, should children come to school if they are unwell. The health and well-being of our pupils and staff remain our priority.

We also want to remind you that if you are facing challenges with school attendance, our school is here to support you. We encourage you to contact us for assistance and suggestions on how we can support regular and consistent attendance.
