New Early Intervention Class

Not only did we welcome new pupils to Junior Infants this year, we also opened a brand new class in our school!

Our first day back to school marked the start of our Early Intervention Class for children with ASD. There are currently 5 children in this class and they are based in the Willow Room in Bethlehem along with their teacher Ms. Kearns.

We are delighted to have opened this class as it is a great resource for the local community.

The idea behind an Early Intervention Class is to help support children before they start primary school. As a result, the children in our class are as young as 3 years old. They have done an amazing job of starting in school and our hope is that

they flourish and grow in school this year.

An Early Intervention Class caters for a maximum of 6 pupils with one teacher and 2 SNAs. In September 2021 we will have 3 places available in this class. We continue to have a primary-age class for children with ASD in school and this class works out of the Holly Room in Bethlehem with Ms. Rice. There will be one place available in our ASD class next September.

Through the efforts of the Parents' Association, and with the support of the wider community, a cheque for €8500 was presented to the school last week....AMAZING!!! While €2000 of this money is intended for use in the playground, the remainder will go towards supporting our efforts to develop the I.T. infrastructure in the school. During the mid-term we hope to install two new interactive boards as a first step in upgrading the older systems in place. If we have learned anything from the past few months it is the importance of being ready for anything! Our next step is to build up a suite of I.T. devices for our pupils so that we can teach our children the necessary skills for operating remotely. We also want to integrate I.T. more in our daily lives and build our general approach to digital literacy within the school. We couldn't do this without your support.
